

# 2025 ADAP Data Report (ADR) Changes

## Reporting Requirements and Timeline

There are several changes for the 2025 ADAP Data Report (ADR) that are outlined below. The ADR opened in the [Electronic Handbooks](#) (EHBs) on Monday April 6; **the submission deadline is Monday, June 1 at 6:00pm ET.**

## Data Element Changes

### Unique Client Identifier (UCI)

Sex at birth is now a component of the UCI. The UCI components and associated coding are noted below. There is no change in the hashing algorithm. Please review [Guidelines for Creating the RSR and ADR Encrypted Unique Client Identifier \(eUCI\)](#) for additional information.

- First and third characters of first name
- First and third characters of last name
- Full date of birth: MMDDYY
- Sex at birth code: 1=Male, 2=Female, 9=Unknown

### Demographics

There are two changes for demographic data elements. Gender ID will no longer be reported in the ADR. In addition, sex at birth is now required for all clients meaning that ADAPs will receive a schema error and won't be able to upload the XML file. If a client's sex at birth is not known, report 'unknown'. The sex at birth coding requirements are listed below.

### Enrollment and Certification

Last eligibility confirmation date has been changed from a complex to a simple data element. This does not affect the reporting requirement to report last eligibility confirmation date in the reporting period for existing clients who were not disenrolled as of the end of the reporting period. Rather, the change is specific to the schema structure. ADR-ready systems are implementing the change as part of the 2025 ADR updates; ADAPs who create their own XML file should review the [ADR XML Schema Implementation Guide](#) and [Schema XSD files](#) for more information regarding the change.

### Insurance Assistance Type

For insurance assistance type, ADAPs no longer need to differentiate between full premium payments and partial premium payments. There is a new response option that groups them

together as 'Full or partial premium payments'. Insurance assistance type coding requirements are listed below.

## Validation Message Changes

Validation messages are reviewed annually with changes made as needed to address reporting needs. There were four validation message changes and no new validation messages. The changes are highlighted below. A full list of the 2025 ADR Validation Messages can be found on the [CAI-DISQ website](#).

## Upload Completeness Report

Updates are also made to the UCR to reflect reporting requirement changes and improve usability. First, the table for gender has been removed. In addition, the Insurance Assistance Type table has been updated so that there is one row for Full or Partial Premium Payment.

An additional change is that there will only be rows for missing or out of range data where they are applicable to the data element. For example, Race allows for missing but not out of range data, so you will only see a missing row in the UCR.

The final change is the availability of hyperlinks to more closely review your data quality issues. More specifically, if there are data missing or out of range, you can click on a hyperlink where you can see the eUCIs for the applicable clients with missing or out of range data.

## Data Applications/Systems

The reporting requirement changes resulted in a change to the ADR schema. Specific information regarding TRAX and CAREWare is provided below. If you use a different system to create the ADR XML, please ensure that you are using the most up to date version.

- **TRAX**

- TRAX has been updated to version 5.12. If you have previously installed TRAX, it should automatically update to the newest version when you open the application. If you are a new TRAX user or need to download TRAX, [click here](#) to download the application.
- There are changes to the TRAX csv templates. Please note that there are only 11 csv templates this year, not 12. The blank csv templates as well as ADR TRAX supporting materials, including the manual, CHEX, and sample CSV files can be found on the [CAI-DISQ website](#) .
